Rules

- 8 teams
- Two qualifying rounds: each team will play against each other team of the same division, yielding two team ranks
- Final round: the two last teams of each round will play against each other for places from 8th to 5th. The first of each round will play against the second of the other to determine who plays the finals for 3rd-4th place and 1st-2nd place.
- Qualifying games will last 15+15 minutes, while each semi-final or final game will last 20+20 minutes. Timing will not be stopped except in case of accidents.
- 5 minutes will be allowed for warm-up before each game; the ice will be cleaned every second game.
- the full IIHF rule-set will apply to the matches, with the following exceptions:
 1. each >2' foul will cause suspension of the player for the rest of the game AND a penalty shot for the offended team
 2. each draw game will be resolved by 3 penalty shots per side, with the exception of the final, where a draw will be followed by a 10' overtime with four movement players in each team, and then, eventually, by 5 penalty shots per side
 3. in the qualifying round, each match will give 3 points to the team winning during the regular game periods, 2 points in case of victory after penalty shots, 1 point in case of defeat after penalty shots and 0 points in case of regular defeat

4. in case one team is more than 5' late at the beginning of a match, the match will be cancelled, and registered with a score of 5-0
5. if two or more teams end the qualifying round with the same points, ranking will be decided on (in order): goal difference, direct match result, number of goals scored, number of penalties
6. any game and tournament related controversy will be decided upon by the referee commission

Teams Arrival

On request, all teams are allowed to drop their equipment at the rink on Friday afternoon-evening. A locked room inside the building will be made available for this purpose, although the rink's management, the tournament organization or CUS Milano can not be held responsible in case of thefts and losses. The same room can be used to store equipment between Saturday and Sunday. Players are kindly asked not to leave equipment inside the locker rooms during the night. The ice rink will open at 8:00 each morning, and will close on 01:00 on Saturday night. All teams are expected to pay the remaining part of the fee before their first match. Enclosed, you will also find a responsibility waiver form, which each team leader must fill and sign, adding the names and signatures of all players on the back.

Moving around in Milan

Enclosed you will find a map of Milan's subway system. The rink is located right next to the "Sesto 1° Maggio FS" station on the red line (top right of the map). Trains start from there to go back the city center until around a few minutes after midnight. After that there are ordinary buses on the same routes of the subway until 01:30. Please notice that from Sesto to Milan and viceversa a more expensive ticket (1.5€) is required instead of the normal one (1€). Please check out www.atm-mi.it for more details on public transportation in Milan. For those arriving by car there is a parking lot available in front of the ice rink. We recommend that teams drive to the rink, drop their equipment, park the car and then move around Milan by public transportation.

Other stations of interest:

- Centrale FS (green/yellow line): Railway Central Station
- Duomo (yellow/red line): Central square of Milan, of interest for sightseers and tourists
- QT8 (red line): the youth hostel is next to this station
- P.ta Garibaldi FS (green line): night-life area, with lots of pubs, restaurants, clubs etc.
- Lanza Brera (green line): another popular night-life and restaurants area, though generally more of a tourist trap and more expensive
